- Over 30,000 students with 2,000 international students from over 100 countries








### Columbia, Missouri

- 4<sup>th</sup> largest city in Missouri
- Annually ranked as one of the best places to live in the United States
- Over 67 outdoor parks and trails
- Safe and fun downtown full of unique shops, music venues & regular community events
- Excellent public school system (with ELL education) and Public Library
- Columbia Public Schools (CPS)
  - About 19,000 students
  - Advance Placement Better than state, national, international peers
  - ACT Better than state and national peers



















#### Truman School of Government and Public Affairs

- Established in 2000
- 150 Students (50 Government officials, 40 Internationals)
- 9 Korean Officials in MPA program and 4 Koreans in Ph.D. program

### 1+1 MPA Program



- 1 year at KDI School (6 credit hours transferred to MU) and 1 year at TSPA (24 Credit hours) = 30 Credit hours > Dual Degree in MPA
- Major Courses:
  - Public and Nonprofit Management
  - Research Methods & Inquiry in Public Affairs I, II
  - Public Policy Processes and Strategies
  - Democracy, and the Public Service



#### **Admission Process**



University of Missouri

- Online application and application fee payment for Graduate School
- Send other materials to Graduate School (transcripts, 3 recommendation letters, official financial support letter, TOEFL score, resume, statement of interest)
- Go to Truman School application website (<a href="https://truman.missouri.edu/current-students/apply-mpa-program">https://truman.missouri.edu/current-students/apply-mpa-program</a>)
- Send the application materials by September 1st
- Truman School will admit applicants by September 30<sup>th</sup>
- Graduate School will admit applications by October 15<sup>th</sup>
- Visa Type is J-1 Student Visa and MU will issue DS-2019 form
- Departure for Missouri: December 20 December 31
- Truman school will start orientation and classes around January 15<sup>th</sup>
- TOEFL 80 (minimum; with no section score below 17), IELTS 6.5 (with no section score below 6), Pearson Test (59), Cambridge (180), Duolingo (105)

  Asian Affairs Center
- Conditional admission if score (sub score) is below the requirement

#### **Student Life**

- 24 credit hours = \$30,500
- Administration fee = \$2,000
- The largest collections in the state: more than 3 million volumes and almost 7 million microforms are in Ellis, Engineering, Geology, Health Sciences, Journalism, Law, mathematical Sciences and Veterinary Medicine libraries.
- The No. 1 university facility in the country: \$50 million complex Mizzou Student Recreation Complex (Sports, September 2005)



# Accent Modification & Pronunciation (AMP) Program

- In collaboration with MU Dept. of Speech, Language and Hearing Sciences
- Pronunciation Clinic
- Once a week for about 50 minutes
- Two scholars per clinical specialist / graduate student





#### Language Partner Program

- Great way of making American friends
- Excellent way to learn about American culture, history, local attractions, etc.
- Find people of similar interests but with different backgrounds and experience





#### **Spouses Program**






### WELCOME TO COLUMBIA, MISSOURI:
