POLIS course structure

Under the KDI agreement, you can start the POLIS course in January 2025

You will take both compulsory and optional modules, split over two semesters

Depending on your programme, you'll study a combination of these module types:

Compulsory modules – All courses include compulsory specialist modules to deepen your knowledge in your chosen area.

Optional modules – Some courses allow you to choose optional modules to tailor your masters to your personal interests and career aspirations.

Dissertation – All courses include a dissertation.

Research modules – Some courses include a choice of research modules, so you can enhance your skills in the most relevant way.

You can select the 180-credit route – which will include optional modules

The 120-credit route has NO options – it is compulsory elements only

Scholarships apply to both routes

POLIS entry requirements


Academic requirements

- From a Korean Bachelors degree: **3.5 out of 4.5** in a social science, humanities, or other related discipline
- Passed all the elements of Semester 1 of KDI's programme with an overall average of B-
- If credit recognition is sought on 120-route, a pass on certain named (core) modules at KDI: see agreement

English language requirements

- IELTS 6.5 with no less than 6.0 in each component
- Or another accepted test eg: TOEFL a total score of 88 with at least 19 in listening, 20 in reading, 22 in speaking, and 21 in writing

How to apply and KDI timeline

Applications are made online via our Applicant Portal.

You will need to prepare:

- Application form
- Degree certificates and academic transcripts
- English language evidence (e.g. IELTS/TOEFL results)
- Personal Statement
- Other documents may include: CV or reference letters

Timeline

POLIS KDI application deadline is **Friday 20 September 2024** for a January 2025 start. The MA ends 12 months later.


