




- a leading centre for public policy research and teaching, focusing on Asia and the Pacific region

✤ A LEGACY THAT SETS OUR STANDARDS



Our school was proudly named in honour of Sir John Crawford (1910-1984), a distinguished Australian Economist, a great Australian policymaker, a distinguished leader of the ANU (as Vice Chancellor 1968-73 and Chancellor 1976-84), and a pioneer in the building of an Asia-Pacific economic and public policy community. Sir John Crawford played a key role in the development of the ANU and the Australian aid programs.

English language requirements



For students from Group A countries, including Australia (visit ANU website for the Group A country list)

- Completion of two years of full-time (or equivalent) tertiary education within the last four years, in the medium of English.
- Study must be undertaken at a recognised institution, in the national education system (or equivalent) of a Group A country, including Australia.

For international students from countries not listed in Group A

- Successful performance in a single acceptable English language test taken within two years from the date of application.
- Documentary evidence which confirms that the tertiary qualification was taught and assessed entirely in English, must be minimum of two years full-time (or equivalent) within the last 4 years.

Requirements for accepted English language tests

- IELTS 6.5, with minimum 6.0 in each band
- TOEFL iBT Paper Edition 570, with a TWE score of 4.5. Use ANU TOEFL code 0506 to report the result.
- TOEFL iBT 80 (excluding paper edition and home edition), with minimum 20 in Reading and Writing and 18 in Speaking and Listening.
- Cambridge CAE Advanced (Post 2015) 176, with a minimum of 169 in all sub-skills.
- PTE Academic 64, with a minimum score of 55 in each of the communicative skills.
