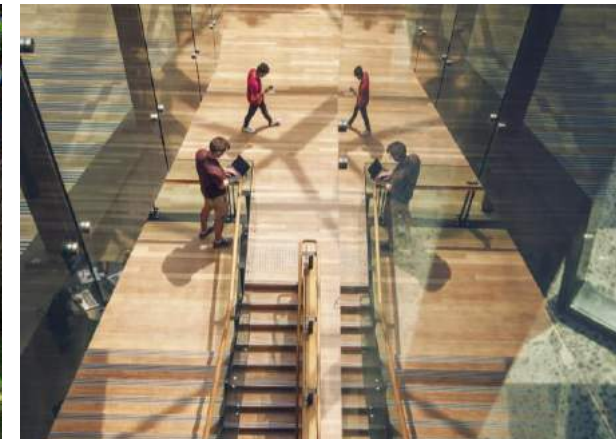

Duration: 1.5 years (24 units)  
Credit from KDI studies:  
1 semester (8 units)

Students to complete 1 year at UQ

### Entry Requirements:

Academic – On completion of KDI studies cumulative GPA of  $2.67/4 = 5/7$

English Language Proficiency: 6.5 overall and a minimum of 6.0 in each sub-band of the IELTS test, or [acceptable scores in equivalent tests \(PDF, 79.2 KB\)](#).

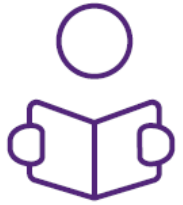

# Bringing Family to Australia

If you want to bring your family to Australia while you study, here's what you'll need to consider.

- **Visas**  
You can include family members on your student visa application. For student visas, family members include your spouse or de facto partner, or children aged under 18.
- **Costs**  
Make sure you're aware of the costs involved in bringing your family – as part of accepting your UQ offer, you'll need to declare that you have access to sufficient funds to support any dependants coming with you.
- **Schooling**  
It is a visa condition that any children aged between 5 and 18 must attend school full-time if they remain in Australia for 3 months or more.



# Bringing Family to Australia

- **Child care**

Independently operated childcare, kindergarten and after-school facilities are available on or near all UQ campuses. Childcare costs in Australia are high (average around A\$100 per child per day).

- **English Language support for your family**

Your adult family members in Australia can attend free English conversation clubs at our St Lucia campus to improve their conversational English skills and confidence.

UQ English Conversation Club is a free service available for:

- adult relatives of UQ students
- visiting professors
- international staff members
- research fellows.

There is no formal pre-entry testing to join. Groups are run by experienced volunteer tutors.

# Applying to UQ – Direct Application

## Step 1: Create an account

Create an account in [UQ Online Applications](#).

## Step 2: Complete your application

Complete all details on the application form and include all required documents. You can save an incomplete form and return later. On your application, let us know if you want to arrange your [Overseas Student Health Cover](#) through UQ.

You'll need to provide:

- a complete academic transcript and/or testamurs for any non-UQ studies

- a copy of your passport or national ID card

- documentation demonstrating your [English language proficiency](#)

*Upload documents as PDFs to reduce their file size*



# Applying to UQ

## Step 3: Submit your application

When you're satisfied your application is complete, submit it.

## Step 4: Manage your application

UQ International Admissions will assess your application. They will contact you through UQ Online Applications with any updates or requests for additional information.

After you've submitted your application, you can log in to [My Applications](#) to:

- access your application
- upload documentation
- provide referee details
- withdraw your application
- accept, decline or defer an offer
- pay all or part of your fees
- view your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE)
- ask a question using the messaging function



# Conditional COE

For students who are unable submit final academic documents to meet offer conditions in time for Semester 2 commencement, a conditional COE may be considered.

To be considered for a conditional COE, students must provide the following.

- Evidence of satisfying program specific English proficiency requirements
- Current academic transcripts showing all results to date

Approved students will be able to accept their offer on the condition that all outstanding documents will be submitted, and all offer conditions are satisfied by the date provided in the Conditional COE request form.





# Responding to your offer

## Offers issued through the online application portal

Once you receive an offer, you will have the option to either accept, decline, or request a change for your offer.

- **Accepting your offer** – if you select this option, and you have satisfied all conditions of your offer, you will receive an invoice within 1 – 2 business days. Once payment is confirmed you will be issued a confirmation of enrolment (COE). This is needed for your student visa.
- **Decline your offer** – if you select this option, your application will be finalized. If you change your mind and wish to reactivate your application, you can submit a request by email to [applicationstatus@uq.edu.au](mailto:applicationstatus@uq.edu.au)

# Accommodation

You can find [accommodation on or off campus](#).

We can help you find somewhere to live that meets your requirements and budget. Costs will depend on the property you choose. The information below provides approximate monthly costs for accommodation.

## On-campus accommodation

A student staying on campus in fully catered accommodation, including utilities

(gas, electricity, water), can expect to pay approximately:

- \$2000 to \$2800 per month at St Lucia

## Off-campus accommodation

Off-campus costs vary depending on your suburb.

A single student living off campus can expect to pay between \$480 and \$1760 per month.

A family (2 adults and 1 child) can expect to pay between \$1700 and \$2160 per month. Approximate family costs assume a dependent child is not school-aged, and doesn't include [child care](#) costs.

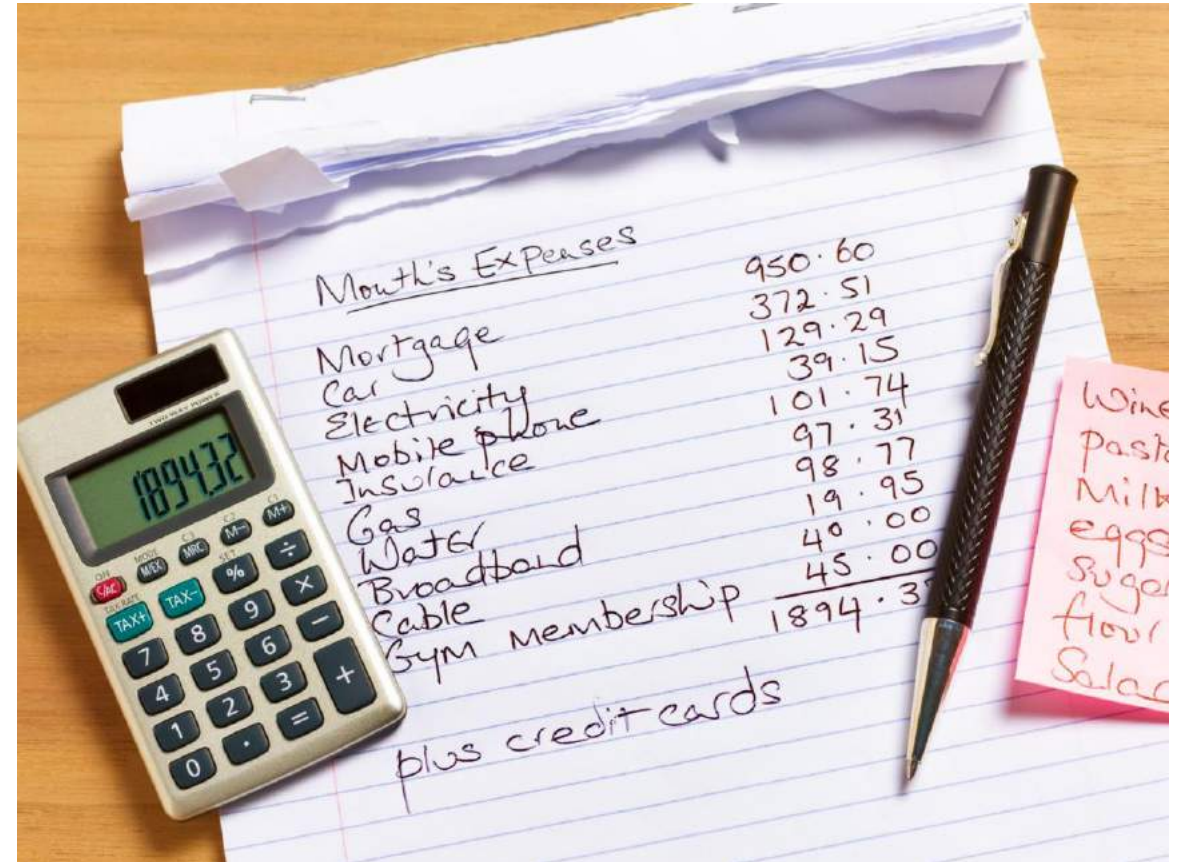


# Other monthly Expenses

How much you spend on living expenses depends on your needs and lifestyle.


This list can give you a better understanding of everyday costs in Brisbane:

- Loaf of white bread: \$1.30
- 12 large eggs: \$6.00
- 1 litre of milk: \$2.50
- 1 kilogram of white rice: \$3.00
- Regular cup of coffee: \$4.40
- Big Mac: \$6.40
- Cinema ticket (concession rate): \$6.50 to \$18.50
- Bus ticket (concession rate): \$1.69 to \$10.17
