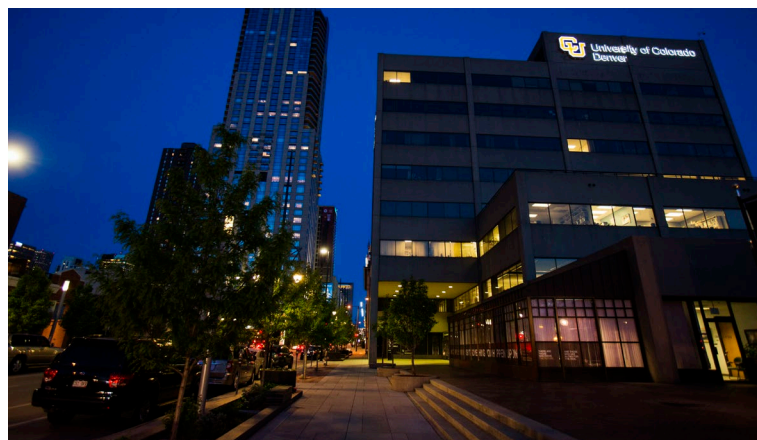

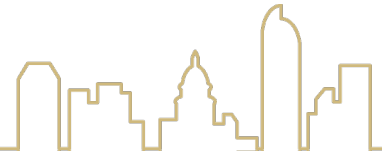

MPA/Master of Arts in Applied Geography and Geospatial Sciences

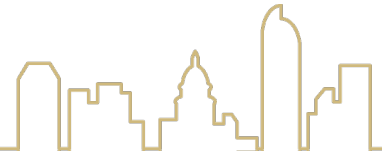
The dual-degree offers students interested in working in the government or nonprofit sectors an opportunity to combine management and leadership training with skills in geospatial sciences, including geographic information systems, remote sensing, computer cartography, and spatial statistics.

MPA/Master of Urban and Regional Planning

The School of Public Affairs and the College of Architecture and Planning jointly sponsor this dual-degree program, which enables you to take the core of both programs and to choose electives that simultaneously count toward both programs and that suit your career and personal goals.

Doctor of Philosophy in Public Affairs

This program emphasizes scholarship in public administration, public policy, public management, and criminal justice/criminology in preparation for positions in academia and consulting firms, public management and administration, public policy analysis, politics and advocacy, and nonprofits.



SPA/KDI Dual-Program



SPA/KDI Dual-Degree Program



- **Program requirements at CU Denver**
 - 36 total credits in "good academic standing"
 - Max 12 credits (4 courses) can be accepted from KDI applied to the SPA dual-degree requirement
- **Required Courses (7 courses)**
 - KDI students must take at least 4 (or more) of the SPA core classes if they do not complete them at KDI
 - **SPA Core Classes (3 credits hours each)**
 - PUAD 5001 - Introduction to Public Administration and Public Service
 - PUAD 5002 - Organizational Management and Behavior
 - PUAD 5003 - Research and Analytic Methods (=KDI Quantitative Method/Introduction to Research Method)
 - PUAD 5004 - Economics and Public Finance -OR- PUAD 5503 - Public Budgeting and Finance
(=KDI Analysis Market and Public Policy)
 - PUAD 5005 - The Policy Process and Democracy
 - PUAD 5006 - Public Service Leadership and Ethics
 - PUAD 5008 - Evidence-Based Decision-Making
 - *Blue Highlights are core classes that have a counterpart in the KDI curriculum





SPA/KDI Dual-Degree Program



- **Elective Courses**

All course descriptions can be found in the [Graduate Academic Catalog](#).

- **Capstone**

With the exception of those pursuing the thesis option, all MPA students must complete the capstone course during the last semester of their degree program. All core classes must be completed before taking the capstone.

- PUAD 5361 - Capstone Seminar (3 credit hours)

- **Thesis option**

The thesis option is available in lieu of the PUAD 5361 - Capstone Seminar for MPA students who have an interest in pursuing a topic in-depth or who are planning to pursue a career in research or academia. Students must receive approval from their faculty advisor or the MPA director to pursue the thesis option.

- PUAD 6950 - Master's Thesis (3-6 credit hours)

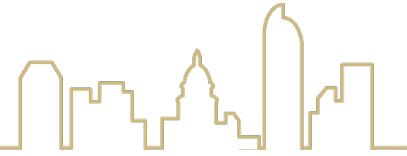

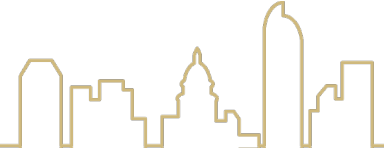

SPA/KDI Dual-Degree Program



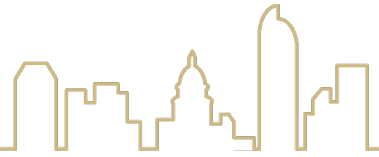
- **Winterim term (January) (If offered)**
 - About 2 weeks prior to the spring semester
 - Starts around January 2nd or 3rd. Classes meet 4 to 5 days per week for roughly 4-5 hours
- **Spring semester (January – May)**
 - Recommend to take 4 core courses and maybe 1 elective course
 - If students have not completed core courses at KDI, it will be 5 core classes (See the previous page for core courses) Sometimes a core course needs to be completed during the summer - can take online.
- **Maymester term (May)**
 - (If offered) It is about 2-3 weeks
 - Elective course to be determined
- **Summer term (June – August)**
 - May take an online course during the summer
 - SPA also offers a few weekend intensives in the summer
 - Good summer class is PUAD 5008 Evidence-Based Decision-Making
- **Fall semester (August – December)**
 - Capstone Seminar and, if necessary, one elective (Note: no core courses concurrent with the capstone)

***Arrival information: Per US Government regulations, students may not enter the US until 30 days prior to the start of classes**

Also, Westminster, Avada, Aurora, Littleton and Lakewood are good places to live where the costs are relatively lower and still have good school districts.

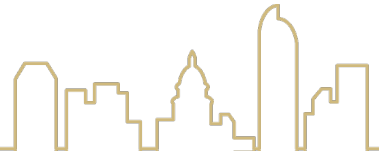
