

The role of PM in Organization

- All the organizations from very small to mega organization irrespective of their classification as public, private or NGO, they all need PM skills and expertise just to survive.
- Without innovation and change they are not sustainable.
- Any innovation or change is nothing but a project.

The role of PM in Organization



What is a project?

- Hard Project: Buildings, bridges, infrastructures, ships, planes, cars, computers, factories, refineries, movies, innovation projects, hardware, software, etc.
- Soft Projects: acquisition and mergers, organizational development, recruitment projects, marketing projects, move projects, event projects (Olympics, Weddings), change projects etc.

What you get out of a MSPM:

- Provide students with a comprehensive foundation in the principles of project management that influence performance at all levels of an organization.
- Provide students with transferable skills that incorporate a mixture of core concepts with knowledge and understanding in problem-solving, critical and system thinking, communication, and team building.




