

Dear Students.

Our gifted project team placed in the Top 20 among 120 student teams in the category "Electro Mobile Prototype Powered by Electric Battery.

START YOUR NU TODAY. TO DO LIST

Read this handbook and get ready to embark upon the great journey ahead that is Nazarbayev University life! Now, these are the quests you will need to accomplish to get your journey going:

- Sign the contract, Consent for personal data protection This is the
 very first and important step that you will need to take in order to kickstart
 your life around here. You will need to find a person responsible for
 students at your school to sign everything.
- Check for medical services and insurance, Application for accommodation, Military Services (for males only) – in order to be on the safer side (just in case) submit everything listed here. You can get all the information from the same person as above.

- 3. **Submission of attestat or other diploma** find the Office of the Registrar in Block 9 and submit your document asap.
- 4. **Sign application for VISA/ISIC card** now this is important. You want to receive your stipend, don't you? Then go and find the Bursar's office on the 5th floor of Block C2 and apply for the card.
- 5. Get ID card, which is also your Library card another very important quest. Without your ID card, you're pretty much helpless. Can't get into your dorm, can't get into the Uni, can't grab a book at the library - can't do much really. So, make sure you receive the ID card from the USM (University Service Management) in Block 22.
- 6. **Check your login and password** this is fairly obvious and self-explanatory. Should you have any issues, do not hesitate to talk to the IT guys at NULITS (Nazarbayev University Library and IT Services).
- 7. **Academic calendar, Classes schedule** don't be late for class, especially in the beginning of the semester. Check your schedule and, if you are a planning type of person, check out the entire academic calendar. You can do this at your school.
- 8. **Meet your adviser** this is serious. Forming a relationship with your adviser helps you get organized and stay on track, while reducing stress and anxiety. This is the person, who will give you answers, tell you where to get the resources and provide support.
- Take roommate's contacts might be a good idea to write down your roommate's credentials. Just in case. You never know.
- 10. Sign up for CAC CareerNet to register for the career related event, to make an appointment for career advising and get updates on various internships and work-on-campus opportunities to become competitive on the labor market.
- 11. Relax! Enjoy your time at NU!







WHO DO YOU HAVE TO KNOW?



- 8. Keep pets in the dormitory (cats, dogs, fish, birds, etc.)
- 9. Use electrical heating devices in the rooms
- 10. Make excessive noise between 11:00 PM and 7:00 AM, including the use of TV sets, radios, stereos and other amplified devices, to play musical instruments, sing, shout or to conduct other actions that disturb the peace and quiet time of other residents
- 11. Store any vehicles in student rooms



POLICIES AND PROCEDURES A TO Z

Academic policies & procedures

These Academic policies & procedures (hereinafter – the APP) is designed for NU undergraduate program students. The APP are to be construed in conjunction with Charter of NU and other internal regulations including but not limited to the Student Code of Conduct and NU Admissions regulations. The APP set minimum standards for NU student; Schools may add additional requirements and standards. For more information please visit NU Student Portal -> Students -> Regulation & Policies.

Alcohol

According to the Rules of Accommodation in the Dormitories of Nazarbayev University, it is restricted to possess and use alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs or other substances in the territory of the Nazarbayev University.

Animals

It is highly prohibited to keep animals (cats, dogs, fish, birds, etc.) in the dormitory. Residents found with animals in their rooms must remove animals immediately.

Appliances

Few block residents are able to use kitchen appliances. The Residents are expected to keep the kitchen appliances in good and clean condition. If problems arise with any of the kitchen appliances, the resident must contact the receptionist at the reception.

Non-permissible Appliances/Electronics

The following items are not allowed in the dormitories:

- ► Air-conditioning units;
- Candle warmers;
- Ceiling fans that are not already installed;
- Dishwashers that are not already installed;
- Room heaters:
- Toasters, convection toaster ovens, or any appliance with an exposed heating element;
- ► Refrigerators (each floor has one);
- Microwaves.

Bicycles

There is a bicycle parking offered in the territory of Nazarbayev University. The front area of living blocks is equipped with a bicycle parking racks. At the end of the semester, please remember to take your bicycle with you. Bicycles found on the racks after the end of the semester are to be confiscated. The limited storage for bicycles will be provided in the winter period.

Check-In/Check-Out Procedures

Procedures of checking-in and checking-out accomplished Upon thorough inspection of the block manager. All residents must properly check-in and check-out of the dormitory. Check-in occurs when the resident takes up a key and check in in the presence of the block manager. There are few procedures to follow before checking in. Residents get to know the procedure before their official check-in/checkout announcement.

Cooking

Cooking is limited to a certain blocks. Usually foundation students are not able to cook as their place of living has no kitchen. However, the floors of the blocks are equipped with refrigerators.

Psychological Counseling Center (PCC)

PCC provides confidential and free psychological support to undergraduate and graduate students of Nazarbayev University. PCC staff conducts individual and group sessions as well as training sessions.

Cheating

According to the NU Student Code of Conduct cheating is prohibited and punishable and is considered as an academic misconduct. Cheating case always ends up with disciplinary panel meeting and could lead student to expulsion from the University.

Curfew

According to the Code of the Republic of Kazakhstan «On Administrative Offenses» it is illegal to be outdoor after 23:00 and in Amusement/entertainment establishments after 22:00 if you still under legal age (18+). Violation will be prosecuted and parents will pay a fine of 15 MCI.

Dining Services

All students have options to be enrolled at Student Meal-Plan or to cook by themselves (except Foundation students). There are several canteens available for residents of dormitories.

For more details, please see the "Campus facilities" section.

Distribution of Advertisements

Only university departments and NU registered student Organization may present items to be posted within the dormitories. If a student organization would like to present items for posting, those items must be brought to the DSA office at 1112 for review and approval. The name of the student organization must present on the advertisement.

E-mail

The Department of Students Affairs (DSA) utilizes the NU email system to communicate with the students. All students are responsible for all material sent to NU e-mail account by the DSA, and should check at least once every 24 hours.

Facility Registration

The facility registration in the dormitories is available by writing a request letter to a campus manager. The reservations must be done 2 days in advance. The request template is available at the reception of each block.

Furniture

All rooms have beds, desks and closet space. Room dimensions vary according to the block. The space is limited and bringing the extra furniture is strongly prohibited. Be careful at moving the items in the room as you are the only responsible person for its condition upon your check out. In addition, it is highly prohibited to move the furniture or other items in the kitchen, halls and atriums.

Guests & Guest Visitation

The privilege to have guests in the dormitories is based upon the mutual respect of the roommates. It is expected that students who live in shared rooms will be respectful and courteous to one another, communicate with one another, and show willingness to compromise.

The guests will be asked to leave if the dormitory staff notices the violation of the rules according to dormitory rules. Guests may visit students during the week and weekends at this time:

Guest Visitation Hours 8:00 AM until 10:00 PM (weekdays and weekends).

Harassment

Activity that is threatening in nature or any form of harassment is prohibited. This can include, but not limited to: posting or distributing material and/or behaving in a manner that is offensive and may contribute to a hostile environment. Any resident who witnesses or experiences harassment in NU dormitories should file a report with a staff member of the DSA. The residential filing a report may elect to keep his/her identity confidential.



Keys & Locks

For the safety of yourself, your roommate, and your personal belongings, we urge residents to lock the doors to their rooms when not present. Students are not permitted to install their own locks in their dormitory rooms.

Laundry Facilities

At the beginning of the semester students have to pay for the laundry services for the term in advance. Each block has its own schedule of receiving and passing the bed inventories. The DSA will inform students about the schedules and unexpected circumstances if such present.

Littering

Please help us maintain clean and well maintained facilities. Residents and visitors to the residence halls and apartments are asked to keep hallways, public areas, stairwells, and landscaping clean and free of trash.

Maintenance

The dormitory staff (USM) provides safety equipment inspections, general maintenance (painting, plumbing, electrical maintenance, and carpentry). The USM staff members clean all public areas of residence halls and apartments, including lobbies, hall and suite bathrooms, corridors, study rooms, kitchens, and laundry rooms.

However, you are responsible for cleaning your own room. If you have maintenance needs or damages, report them to the reception. If emergency repair work is needed after 4 p.m. on weekdays or anytime on weekends, consult the front desk.

Medical Service

The medical office provides the first medical emergency service 24 hours, 7 days a week. Please find more details on "Campus facilities" section.

Noise & Quiet Hours

The Department of Student Affairs supports the mission of NU and in those efforts aims to create academically supportive environments for all residents. As a resident, you may be asked by other residents or staff to adjust the volume of your activities to reduce the disturbance to other members of the dormitory. Please be considerate and flexible.

It is prohibited make excessive noise between 11:00 PM and 7:00 AM.



Parking in the NU territory allowed only for those who do not have a room in the dormitory. Parking spaces are limited and it spread equally among the applicants.

Plagiarism

According to the NU Student Code of Conduct plagiarism is prohibited and punishable and is considered as an academic misconduct. Plagiarism case always ends up with disciplinary panel meeting and could lead student to expulsion from the University.

Room Changes

Room changes without prior notice and permission of the DSA is prohibited and may lead to an immediate eviction from the dormitory. Students allowed changing a roommate or room upon its availability once in 6 months.

Room Entry by Staff

The DSA staff members make every reasonable effort to respect your privacy. There are times, however, when authorized personnel may enter your room. This occurs under the following circumstances:

- ▶ When either you or your roommate provide permission when there is an immediate threat, or reason to believe that there is a threat, to the health and/or safety of residents or property.
- ▶ When it is necessary to preserve campus order, security, or discipline.
- ▶ During fire drills, alarms, or severe weather evacuations for purposes of routine maintenance repairs or inspections.
- ► To conduct semester health and safety inspections after receiving at least 24-hour notice.
- ▶ To conduct end of the semester room inspections.
- ▶ To conduct room inspections after a resident moves out of a space.

Maintenance staff members will enter rooms to make requested or needed repairs when needed. The Department of Student Affairs may conduct periodic unannounced safety inspections of your room to ensure that fire-safety equipment is operational and those smoke detectors have not been covered or disengaged. If you have reason to believe that your room has been entered, inspected, or searched under conditions not consistent with the above statements, contact your RA and/or the block manager.

Safety Equipment

Safety equipment including sprinklers, smoke detectors, heat sensors, fire exit signs, fire extinguishers, pull stations, hoses, alarm bells, and any other safety equipment is necessary to safeguard residents. Activating, handling, using, or interfering with any fire or safety equipment for any reason other than an emergency is prohibited at all times. Examples include but are not limited to discharging fire extinguishers, touching fire alarm pull stations or fire hoses, hanging objects from sprinkler heads, tampering with EXIT signs, or striking safety equipment with an object.

Tobacco

To support the rights of all residents and in compliance with university policy, residential communities are tobacco-free, including traditional legal substances as well as smokeless tobacco and e-cigarettes (electronic cigarettes). The use of tobacco products is prohibited in both individual rooms and in public areas within the halls and apartments. The use of tobacco and tobacco related items is also prohibited on campus. Students must move to off-campus locations or a personal vehicle with closed windows for the use and storage of tobacco products.

Vandalism

According to the NU Student Code of Conduct vandalism is prohibited and punishable and is considered as an non-academic misconduct. Vandalism case always ends up with disciplinary panel meeting and could lead student to expulsion from the University. All financial expenses occurred to fix the facility will be covered by student committed vandalism.

Weapons

Possession of firearms (including but not limited to air pistols, BB guns, and paint guns), facsimile weapons, ammunition, explosives, fireworks, knives (other than kitchen utensils), or dangerous weapons is prohibited in the residence halls and apartments and may result in immediate termination of a resident's housing contract. Disciplinary action will also be taken by the university.

ANNUAL MEDICAL CHECK-UP

All newly enrolled students, as well as current students, must undergo a special medical check-up at Sinoasia B&R. All the details about logistics will be sent to you via e-mail. This medical check-up is aimed at providing a full medical examination of students to identify various diseases at the earlier stages and provide appropriate treatment.

MEDICAL CERTIFICATE ISSUANCE

If you have missed classes due to health issues, you need to provide appropriate medical certificates/notes (spravka) to the school administration. Medical certificates issued by Medical office are considered to be eligible. Certificates issued by the other medical institutions must be certified by the UHC Medical office, no later than 3 days after the issuance.

Please note: if there are any issues or specifications about your health condition (any speech problems, hearing/vision problems) school administration or therapists should know, please let us know. You are welcome to see your school manager or manager of the Department of Student Affairs.

PHC services are provided free of charge according to the GVFMC and include the following:

- Diagnosis and treatment of most common diseases, as well as injuries, poisoning, and other urgent conditions;
- Protection of the family, maternity, paternity and childhood, including family planning;
- Preventive measures and risk factor identification:
- Health screening for early detection of diseases;
- Raising awareness on the most common pathologic conditions and healthy life style promotion;
- Hygienic training and outreach work on safe water supply and rational nutrition of the population;
- Sanitary and anti-epidemic and sanitary-preventive measures in the foci of infectious diseases;
- ► Social and psychological services.

Moreover, the NU students who are traveling abroad for their studies may access UHC to complete the health forms with details of their vaccination and other health related information. The examinations requested by a hosting university which are not provided as per GVFMC shall be paid additionally.

For ease of access for the NU community, the following health services are available at the UHC as of May 2018:

- Consultations by general practitioners, therapists, pediatricians and specialists: cardiologist, neurologist, ophthalmologist, otorhinolaryngologist (ENT-doctor), surgeon, obstetrician-gynecologist (Ob-Gyn), allergist;
- ▶ Diagnostics: broad spectrums of lab tests, including PCR, microbiology; ultrasound (abdomen, kidney, gynecology, vessels, heart); treadmill test; electrocardiography (ECG); Holter monitoring; ambulatory blood pressure monitoring (ABPM); spirography; audiometry; eye examinations; fluorography (arranged through a fluromobile or referral to Republican Diagnostic Center (RDC), UMC);
- Issuance of medical certificates/notes (spravka) after relevant examinations;
- Procedures prescribed by the physicians: minor surgical procedures, injections and infusions;
- Massage;
- ▶ Medical check-ups with provision of the following forms:
 - Pre-employment/enrolment examination (Form 086-u)
 - Check-ups for studying abroad (Form 082) (e.g. requirement of Bolashak program)
 - Personal medical records.

Additionally, UHC is in the process of arranging for the NU students and employees the mandatory medical check-ups to minimize the time required for this process.

University Student fund is transferred ONLY through the personal account on the web site www.my.nu.edu.kz

The minimum amount of the student contribution, which is approved annually by the University Student Government decision in consultation with the Department of Student Affairs, for 2018-2019 academic year payment per semester is 3,500 (three thousand five hundred) KZT for undergraduate and graduate programs students; 5000 (five thousand) KZT for NUFYP students (per semester).

ABOUT BURSAR'S OFFICE

The main task of the Bursar's Office is to monitor and control financial transactions between the University and all students including those of the foundation, undergraduate and graduate programs. Our office oversees the payments of the stipends, student travel expenses, tuition fees and other services provided to the students.

THE "NAZARBAYEV UNIVERSITY" STIPEND

The "Nazarbayev University" stipend is awarded to students studying under the "Nazarbayev University" educational grant, in accordance with the procedures established by the Regulations on stipend support provision to the students of the autonomous organization of education "Nazarbayev University" approved by the Managing Council.

The amount of the "Nazarbayev University" stipend is determined by the Government of the Republic of Kazakhstan in accordance with the legislation of the Republic of Kazakhstan.

The "Nazarbayev University" stipend is awarded to foundation students and doctoral students for the whole period of study and is paid on a monthly basis.

During the first semester of study the "Nazarbayev University" stipend is awarded to bachelor and master students unconditionally and is paid on a monthly basis.

In the following semesters, the "Nazarbayev University" stipend is awarded to bachelor and master students by the results of the examination session in accordance with criteria for awarding and paying the "Nazarbayev University" stipend presented in the Regulations, and is paid monthly.

THE STIPEND OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF KAZAKHSTAN

The Stipend of the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan is awarded for to bachelor students starting from 3rd year and master students starting from 2nd year with "excellent" grades (A, A-), who study either on the basis of the Nazarbayev University educational grant or on a paid basis. The Stipend of the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan is paid out of the republican budget funds in the amount and manner established by the legislation of the Republic of Kazakhstan.

The Stipend of the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan is awarded by the decision of the President of the University, on the basis of the Stipend Committee recommendations and approval of the Academic Council of the University.






EMPLOYMENT DESTINATION ACROSS INDUSTRIES (undegraduates)*




EMPLOYMENT DESTINATION ACROSS INDUSTRIES (undegraduates)*




OVERALL NUMBER OF GRADUATES OF CLASSES 2015-2018*









