

Australian National University

- The ANU is consistently ranked as a world leading university
 #1 in Australia- 24 in the world
- Nobel Prize winners: 6- highest of all Australian universities
- Most highly qualified staff in Australia: 80% of academic staff hold a PhD
- The best Student to Academic staff ratio of the top universities in Australia **10:1**
- The ANU was established in 1946 as a research only university and did not have coursework undergraduate and postgraduate programs until 1960
- The ANU has about 25,000 students

Most Employable Graduates

ANU is ranked #1 in Australia and #20 in the world for producing the 'most employable graduates', in the Emerging Global Employability University Survey, 2013



- ANU is the only Australian institution, that is part of the prestigious **International Alliance of Research Universities**
- ANU is a member of the Group of Eight (Go8)
- **94%** of ANU academic's **research is rated above or well above the world standard**, as reported in Study Assist, Australian Government 2014
- 78.3% of ANU academic staff hold a PhD
- In 2016, ANU achieved the **maximum QS Five Star Plus rating** one of only twelve universities in the world to do so
- ANU has the **smallest student to academic staff ratio** of the top universities in Australia, at 10:1

- Students become valued members of the region's leading public policy community, and actively contribute to the impact being made on the challenges of the world




Master of Environmental and Resource Economics

English Language Requirements and GPA

- **IELTS 6.5**: minimum 6.0 in each band
- TOEFL IBT 80: minimum 20 in Reading and Writing and 18 in Speaking and Listening *
- ANU Access English Program (10 weeks, direct-entry)
 - Entry: IELTS 6.0, minimum 5.5 in each band
- ANU English for Academic Purposes (12 + 10 weeks, direct-entry)
 - Entry: IELTS 5.5, minimum 5.0 in each band
- **GPA**: 5 out of 7 or international equivalent.




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Kambri at ANU
