<b>Academic/Experience Requirements:</b>	<p>MBA students: have an average age of 32, and 8-10 years of experience; enrollment in an MBA program at home university</p>
<b>Full-time Workload :</b>	<p>PUC has no set full-time course load requirements. In general, full-time students take 4 courses but most Exchange Students take between 3-4 courses. Undergraduate courses run 20 weeks.</p> <p>MBA courses run 13 weeks.</p> <p>Each Course at the MBA has 33 contact hours.</p>
<b>Learning Expectations:</b>	<p>Class format is a combination of lectures and in-class presentations, group projects and case studies. Low attendance will result in lower grades. Active class participation is usually part</p>

of each student's final grade. Grading is based on papers, case studies, and group projects. Exam format varies. The final exams take place at the end of each term and are obligatory. Class sizes are from 20-60 students for undergraduate programs. Classes are smaller for MBA students.

## **Insurance**

### ***Are exchange students required to purchase a Health insurance compulsory plan?***

International Health Insurance is mandatory. Students must purchase their own Health insurance in their countries of origin before they travel to Chile.

### ***Are medical services offered in campus?***

Yes. Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile has complete student health services, including all medical specialties, dental attention, psychological attention and counselling, for the exclusive use of its students (Students must have their own Health Insurance and pay for the cost of all health services). Students must ask for refunding of any medical expense made in Chile to his own Health Insurance company.

Insurance UC does not offer Health Insurance. Any fees other than tuition (e.g. student services) \*The student must ask for refunding of any medical expenses made in Chile to his/her own health insurance company
